Hope Distribution Center Warehouse: HDC serves as the central location for food distribution to eight food pantries and 21 counties served by Catholic Charities of Northeast Kansas. The warehouse helps us ensure a balanced inventory for all of our pantries. We rely on the generosity of volunteer-driven food drives, gifts-in-kind, as well as financial contributions to help us keep our warehouse shelves stocked to meet the growing needs of individuals and families throughout our service area. Volunteers are welcomed at HDC through a variety of volunteer opportunities, including sorting food, hygiene and other items, packaging and taking inventory of donations, and assisting in the food pantry. HDC is located at 1708 Steele Road, Kansas City, KS and is open Monday – Friday 8:30am-4:30pm.

Mobile Food Distribution: Volunteers are needed on the 3rd Saturday of each month at J.C. Harmon High School (2400 Steele Rd., Kansas City, KS 66106) to distribute fresh food to 300 families. Shalom House: Groups of volunteers that are 18 years of age and older are needed at Shalom House through our Dinner Ministry program.
